



- Hierarchy of consequences.




Middle School Parents...

- digital hall pass system

- students request and receive digital passes for various locations like the restroom, nurse, or counselor
- provides real-time data on student locations.
- improves safety, reduce disruptions, and enhances accountability for students.



Dress Code Policy


Colonial Expectations for Student Dress

- NO see through/sheer shirts, tank top shirts, tube tops, crop tops, bare backs, or short shorts.
- NO "spaghetti strap" shirts. Cleavage should be covered.
- NO hats, hoods, bonnets, do-rags.
- NO sunglasses.
- NO decals, slogans or sayings on clothing that contain reference to illegal or immoral behaviors or any type of profanity and/or racial slurs.
- Appropriate safe shoes are to be worn at all times for appropriate school activities. NO slippers.
- Shorts, skirts and dresses are to be of fingertip length.
- Pants are to be worn around the waist.



Code of Conduct Violations

- Violations of the code of conduct may result in student being denied access to school activities.







Social Media & Mental Health

- 11-15 year olds in the United States that spent more than 3 hours a day on social media might be at an increased risk for mental health problems like anxiety and depression.
- Time spent with peers has been on a consistent decline since 2011.
- Time spent alone has drastically increased since 2011.
- Adolescents who spend more time on screen activities are 47% more likely to be unhappy (highest risk is in MS students).
- Teens who spend 3+ hours on electronic devices are 35% more likely to have at least one suicide risk factor.
- Nonscreen activities (exercise, clubs, sports, music groups, etc.) lower suicide risk factors.
- These risks increase as screen time increases.

Cell Phones


GB is a Cell Phone Use-Free School

- Our expectation is that there is no student cell phone use while at school.
- All student devices will remain out of sight (backpack, locker, at home).
- While in school, students will be provided a tool to help keep devices

safe while out of sight.

"Out of sight, out of trouble."








GB is a cell phone use-free school

- Commitment to a cell phone use-free learning environment.
- Students are permitted to bring cell phones to school but are not permitted to use them
 or have them out during the school day.
- Fosters a more focused, engaging, and enriching educational experience for all students.
- Headphones or earbuds should not be worn during the school day unless they are being used in the classroom for instructional purposes. (They cannot be worn outside of the classroom.)
- Here's what the data tells us. Students have...
 - Improved Academic Performance
 - Enhanced Focus and Engagement
 - Better Mental Health and Well-being
 - Stronger Social Interactions
 - Reduced Disruptive Behavior
