

What to expect in the voting booth:

SECTION 2 - AUTHORIZATION TO ISSUE BONDS
The Colonial School District is seeking authorization to issue bonds in the amount of \$48,779,223 for Major Capital Improvements. The bonds are to be financed through an increase in property taxes and represent 40% of the total cost of \$121,959,082 for planning, renovation, and equipping schools as outlined on the posted Notice of Election.

Operating vs. Capital Requests

The referendum has 2 different components that will be voted on separately.


The operating request will provide increased funding for daily operations. The capital request provides funds for our needed major renovation projects.

Impact to the tax rate: \$0.25 added in FY 25 \$0.10 added in FY 26 \$0.05 added in FY 27 Impact to the tax rate: Varies over the bond repayment period Maximum added over today's rate is 9.9 cents in FY 2027 then gradually declines.

Who can vote on the 29th?

- To vote in the referendum, you must:
 - Be a citizen of the United States and the State of Delaware.
 - Live within Colonial.
 - Be 18 years of age on or before the day of the election.
 - Provide proof of identity and address. This includes:
 - Delaware driver's license
 - Delaware ID card
 - Work ID card with photo and home address
 - U. S. postal material with street address

• To vote in the referendum, <u>YOU DO NOT</u>:

- Need to be a registered voter
- Need to own your home/property







Summary of Capital Projects

Secure Entrances/Vestibules and Other Security Enhancements \$9.9 million



Capital Request - Key takeaways

\star The average age of Colonial buildings is 60 years.

- ★ The State will provide 60% of the funding (\$73.2 million) and <u>we must provide</u> the remaining 40% (\$48.8 million) to secure the State's investment.
 - The state funds cannot be repurposed or used for anything other than the projects we submitted.
 - A no vote means that the state dollars will NOT come to Colonial.
- ★ The athletic facilities at William Penn have not seen any significant investments in over 30 years.
- ★ Over the past 7 years, we have invested over \$50 million in our facilities through strategic investments that did not have any direct taxpayer impact.




Not all funds are created equal.
